Better late than never, we are glad to announce that the 2021 edition of the Piolets d'Or will take place from the 26th-29th November in the beautiful mountain city of Briançon, France.

The 2021 edition will be special for three main reasons:

COVID-19 heavily impacted local and international freedom of movement throughout 2020, and consequently there was much less mountaineering activity. Despite this, there were several fine surprises.

The 2021 edition will present the opportunity to revisit 30 years of alpine history seen through the prism of the Piolets d'Or. We are confident that this will trigger passionate but hopefully amicable and respectful debate.

The event will take place in the highest city in the Alps, offering unique architecture and fortifications. Briançon also provides an amazing basecamp for mountaineers. It is surrounded by various limestone
